### Feed the Hungry & Opportunities



Today is February 26th; the March newsletter is in the mail, and I am writing the April News & Views quite early as I am scheduled to be in Togo this March. I would be hard pressed to get everything done after my return on the 27th. In this report I want to share with you what was accomplished in our effort to **"Feed the Hungry"** in Malawi and then report on some updates and close with another opportunity for us, with God's help, **"to be the difference"** in the lives of others.

Stephen Tambuli reported back to me with several photos of him distributing the sacks of rice & beans to Christian and non-Christian families that were starving as a result of insects and a lack of rain destroying their crops during a time when there should have been an abundance of rain. For **\$62** we could help feed a family for a couple of months giving them opportunity to find other provision and plant new crops once the rain came. We were able to send Stephen **\$4819.00**. In addition, another good friend, Berkley Badger sent additional help through his ministry JCB International. Stephen was able to make the money go much further than we had expected and 150 people received bags of rice & beans. Here are some of the photos: **PTL for making a difference! In November of 2021 we purchased a 3-ton flat-bed truck to help us get the building supplies to the remote areas where we are building new churches with many of our graduates and Pastors who are operating CTC programs in their facilities. I recently received this photo of our truck being loaded with the materials to build the truss system for a new sheet-metal roof. I am hoping to



return to Malawi later this year to see the new churches that we helped to build in 2021 and speak with the pastors about what God has done with the new facilities. With all of the uncertainty and challenges that face us on the earth today it is good to remind ourselves that God is very much alive and working through His people to spread the gospel of Christ!

### URGENT HELP IS NEEDED!



Pictured here is George Kurenji, our CTC director for much of our work in Africa, and two former Muslim young men. These young men, John 19, and James 20 (their Christian names) were born into Muslim families. John came from a family with 7 children and James from a family with 9 children. They both came to faith in Christ during a crusade conducted by Pastor Sethi Munenwa one of our CTC graduates pictured next with

his wife, Deborah Fatima Esther and 2 of their 7 children. The result of their newfound faith in Christ was that their parents disowned, disinherited, and chased them from their home with threats of death for deserting their family religion. This also discontinued their educational funding. They are presently being hosted by a pastor who found them in a temporary camp for victims of a landslide that happened in the Uvira area of the D.R. Congo starving with no food or long-term place to stay. Pastor Sethi Munenwa has baptized them in water, and they are



presently staying in the church building for now with the landslide victims, but it is not conducive for that other than being inside and they are attending CTC classes. They want to complete the full CTC program while attending university. Both men have finished their primary and secondary education and are qualified to attend university level training. It is very difficult to find any kind of work for them that would support them. Thus they have need for someone to stand with them. Their needs at this time are the following:

- ♦ Rental house with food & some clothing. **\$100 per month.**
  - ♦ University education is **\$400 per year per student.**
  - ♦ CTC books & materials for their training. **\$180 total each.** The CTC training is free except for printed materials. **\$3000 will give them a year of care for both.**
- Mark your gift “2 boys”.**



In addition to the above situation you see here a man digging down about 5 feet to uncover church materials that were covered over by mud after a flood swept through destroying Pastor Sethi’s home, church bldg., and church office in the D.R. Congo. Presently, Pastor Sethi & Deborah and their 7 children, along with 3 orphans are also staying with James & John and the

other victims. His wife, Deborah wants to start a business to help her family and ministry. She needs **\$700** to help her get started as a fish vendor. Outside of that they need about **\$200** per month for a year to get them on their feet again. If you would like to help, please **mark your gift “Ps. Sethi.”**

Realize that these opportunities for us to make a difference are an outgrowth of CTC’s involvement in an area undergoing a very difficult situation. I am reminded that the enemy of our souls comes but to steal, kill and destroy. The enemy looks for weakness, and then seeks an advantage. We see it today in world events, and often bad news fills the evening report. **We, with God’s help, can be the difference for our brothers and sisters in Christ.** Please do something to help and continue to stand with us knowing that we pray for and count on God’s blessing through you!
