UPDATE BEFORE BOTSWANA



I usually write these monthly newsletters early in the month so that you receive them early in the month for which they are titled. Unfortunately, most of the time I am reporting on things that have passed. I have resisted using my Facebook account unless something unusual is taking place. I think I have a Twitter account but I can't remember using it. Perhaps I am behind the times and should make better use of these platforms of communication. I would like to know what you think as I pray about expanding our circle of communication. I send out about 600 newsletters each month, most of which go to Florida and Indiana, places where I have lived and ministered. Of those 600, we receive about 30 to 40 contributions each month. That support keeps us moving forward but not at the pace I feel we should go given the times we are living in. New Hope has a tremendously successful summer basketball camp for kids. ITM was one of the sponsors for the camp this past summer where nearly 200 kids attended. Here are some photos that I lifted from her newsletter. Sondra is a great blessing to



the work of the Kingdom! During the camp, Sondra was also involved with a time of daily Bible study and prayer. She reported that on

the last day of her class, almost all the kids raised their hands and prayed to receive Jesus! Totally Awesome!!! They finished off their time together giving each of the kids the opportunity to be baptized in water.



Sincelejo, Columbia

This program is under the direction of Don Wolfram, a longtime friend and fellow missionary who does many things in addition to running CTC programs in Ecuador and Columbia. Pictured here are pastor Jose Herrera our host, then Don, me, and Pastor Rodrigues, one of the teachers. Don had invited me to teach the first subject in a new CTC location outside the town





of Sincelejo. You don't realize how high up on the mountain the town is until you make the 20-minute trip down the

mountain to where the CTC and new church are located. There were about 30 students who



attended when able during the week. From that group, we have five who completed all the subjects and were the first graduating class for Sincelejo. The first graduate in the photo (far right) is Pastor Herrera's wife Sofy. Our congratulations to these five pioneers! New classes are already underway which will give those who missed some classes the opportunity to get

caught up and eventually graduate.

Matagalpa, Nicaragua



In addition to the graduation in Columbia, we celebrated our second graduation in Matagalpa, Nicaragua, where Alfredo Martinez and his wife, Coralia, oversee our ten CTC programs in Nicaragua. This is amazing when you consider that



this country is ruled by Communist leaders who do much to hinder Christian activities. This second graduation yielded six new graduates into fulltime ministry. Like the folks in Columbia, they have started new classes training more laborers for God's harvest! What a great report from Sondra!

Kenya Graduations

Dr. George Kurenji also reported graduations that took place in August. Because the two locations, Nakuru and Elementaita, Kenya, are close together, they held one graduation ceremony.

There were 30 students who completed all the CTC program. Here they are with instructors seated. I believe Dr. Kurenji is the gentleman seated with the red sash about his neck and shoulder. Dr. Kurenji oversees 32 CTC locations in seven countries, which is one



of the reasons we help support his family and travel expenses. Your faithful support is making this possible!

Finally, I wanted to share one more photo of the roof for Pastor Victor in Lagos, Nigeria. He recently sent me a finished photo,



while also reporting that they were over halfway to getting the electrical work completed inside the church. We were able to send them \$5000 to help with this cost. His CTC program has just finished their first semester of classes and are doing well.

Pastor Francisco's New Church in Ecuador
